The Women's Program provides support, networking, and career planning for adults in transition, individuals changing careers, dislocated workers, displaced homemakers, single parents and individuals pursuing careers nontraditional for their gender.

Individual career counseling, career research and a variety of seminars on career planning, goal setting, and other personal growth topics are available.

The Women's Program office is located in the Career Center on the Leesburg Campus. Services are provided to the South Lake and Sumter Campuses on an itinerant basis. The Displaced Homemaker Program
